Dates for your diary

PE

Homework

Homework will be given out every <u>Thursday</u> and is to be returned the following Monday. Please support your child to complete the activities set.

Spare Clothes

We ask that all children come to school in pants (no nappies or pull-ups please). A set of spare clothes can be brought in and left on your child's peg in case of any accidents. Please can all clothes be labelled.







Communication and Language

We will:

- Understand a question or instruction that has two parts, such as: "Get your coat and wait at the door".
- Know many rhymes and be able to talk about familiar books.
- Use talk to organise ourselves and our play:
 "Let's go on a bus... you sit there... I'll be the driver."



Literacy

We will:

- Enjoy rhymes and rhythmic activities.
- Listen and join in with rhymes and stories. Continue to give meanings to our marks.
- Recognise words with the same initial sound.



Maths

We will:

- Develop fast recognition of up to 3 objects.
- Recite numbers in order to 10.
- Experiment with symbols and numerals.
- Use the language of quantities e.g. 'more' and 'a lot'.
- Make patterns with shapes.
- Explore 2D shapes using mathematical language.





Physical Development

We will:

- Take part in group activities which we make up for ourselves.
- Choose the right resource to carry out our own plan.
- Use one-handed tools and equipment eg. scissors.



Understanding the World

We will

- Begin to make sense of our own life-story and family's history.
- Talk about the difference between materials and changes we notice.
- Learn that there are different countries and talk about their differences using photos.



Expressive Art and Design

We will:

- Create closed shapes with continuous lines and use these to represent objects.
- Explore colour and colour-mixing.
- Listen with increased attention to sounds and songs.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will:

- Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.
- Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important.
- Develop appropriate ways of being assertive.
- Talk about our feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'.
